The Cuyamaca WD was formed in 1982 to assume ownership of a private water utility. The District maintains four wells and two potable reservoir tanks and distributes local groundwa-

ter to approximately 300 permanent

and seasonal residents.

LAFCO approved a sphere-ofinfluence for the Cuyamaca Water District in 1984 that is coterminous with the district boundary. The sphere was

last affirmed in 2013.
