## DISTRICT BACKGROUND

The Upper San Luis Rey Resource Conservation District (RCD) provides educational and technical assistance to help property owners within the RCD in implementing conservation practices for soil, water, and other natural resources.

The RCD, which was established in 1945, includes approximately 402 square miles just south of the San Diego/Riverside County boundary. The RCD relies on federal and state agencies for technical assistance and works in conjunction

The RCD is a member of the Upper San Luis Rey Watershed Authority, which is responsible for maintaining a sustainable San Luis Rey River Basin; and in partnership with the California Integrated Waste Management Board, organizes solid waste cleanup programs throughout the district service area.

The Upper San Luis Rey RCD is governed by a five-member Board of Directors. Directors are appointed to four-year terms by the County Board of Supervisors from a list of eligible candidates proposed by the RCD according to Board Policy A-134, *Procedures for Appointment to Resource Conservation District Boards of Directors*.

LAFCO approved a sphere-of-influence for the Upper San Luis Rey RCD in 1986 that is larger than the district boundary. The sphere was last affirmed in 2013.
