



SUBJECT:	Ratification of an Administrative Approval "Hamilton Lane–Felicita Road Outside Wastewater Service Agreement" - City of Escondido (OAS19-15)

SUMMARY

The San Diego County Local Agency Formation Commission (LAFCO) will consider ratification of an administrative approval by the Executive Officer of an outside-of-agency wastewater service agreement involving the City of Escondido. The agreement authorizes the City to provide public wastewater service to two unincorporated and developed singlefamily residential parcels and was approved by the Executive Officer consistent with policies given a documented public health threat involving failed septic systems. Approval has been termed on receipt of the landowners filing an application to annex the affected territory.

BACKGROUND

Statute and Policy Direction

Government Code Section 56133 prohibits cities or special districts from providing new or extended services by contracts or agreements outside of their jurisdictional boundaries without LAFCO review and approval less certain and limited exemptions. In addition, cities or districts may only provide services by contract or agreement outside of their boundaries and within their spheres of influence in anticipation of later changes of organization to

annex the affected territory. If the affected territory lies outside the subject agencies' spheres of influence, outside-of-agency services may only be extended in response to documented threats to the health or safety of the public or the residents.

San Diego LAFCO's adopted policies outline procedures to consider requests for cities and districts to provide outside-of-agency services by contracts or agreements. These policies include providing the Executive Officer with administrative authority to approve agreements in response to documented health and safety emergencies and generally premised on remediation of failed and/or failing wells and septic systems. The administrative approval requires applicants to provide substantiating documentation from the County Department of Environmental Health (DEH). The policies also require the Executive Officer to inform the Commission of all administrative approvals at the next available meeting.

Administrative Approval

San Diego LAFCO received a request from two interested landowners – Shaw and Ingram – on August 19, 2019 for approval to enter into an outside-of-agency wastewater service agreement with the City of Escondido in advance of processing a reorganization.¹ The service agreement involves connection of two non-contiguous unincorporated and developed single-family residential parcels to the City's public wastewater system to respectively remedy failing onsite septic systems. The two subject parcels are located at 903 Hamilton Way and 2517 Felicita Road and 0.35 and 0.28 acres in size, respectively.² Both subject parcels lie within the City sphere of influence. Staff coordinated with the City and DEH and the Executive Officer proceeded to issue an administrative approval on August 30th.³ Approval was termed on the landowners filing an application to reorganize the affected territory and annex to the City.

DISCUSSION

This item is for San Diego LAFCO to ratify an earlier administrative approval by the Executive Officer involving an outside-of-agency wastewater service agreement allowing the City of Escondido to extend wastewater service to 903 Hamilton Lane and 2517 Felicita Road.⁴ The item also provides the Commission the opportunity to offer related direction in processing these types of requests proceeding forward consistent with membership preferences.

¹ Consistent with Commission policy and practice the reorganization would involve annexation of the affected territory to the City of Escondido and concurrent detachment from County Service Area No. 135 – Regional Communications. An associated filing with the State Board of Equalization would also be required to remove the affected territory from Rincon del Diablo Municipal Water District's fire improvement district.

² The County of San Diego Assessor's Office identifies the subject parcels as APN 238-360-05 and APN 238-360-19.

³ In letters dated November 16, 2018 and May 22, 2019, DEH confirms each property's on-site septic is experiencing failure and recommends connection to public wastewater service to 2517 Felicita Road, as well as 903 Hamilton Lane.

⁴ The affected territory is within a mailing zip code assigned to the unincorporated area of the City of Escondido.

ANALYSIS

The Executive Officer's administrative approval allowing the City of Escondido to contractually extend wastewater service beyond its jurisdictional boundary to 903 Hamilton Lane and 2517 Felicita Road conforms to San Diego LAFCO policies and practices. Approval expedites connection of the two developed residential subject parcels to the City's public wastewater system and follows coordination with DEH attesting to the public health threat associated with the failing septic systems. Approval has also been termed on the receipt of an application by the landowners to annex the affected territory to the City and in doing so aligns with the Commission's preference for services to ultimately conform to jurisdictional boundaries. Ratification serves to formalize the approval under statute and clarifies the Commission's interest in the Executive Officer administratively processing future requests similarly.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended San Diego LAFCO ratify the Executive Officer's administrative approval authorizing the City of Escondido to extend public wastewater service to 903 Hamilton Lane and 2517 Felicita Road. This recommendation draws on the preceding analysis and is consistent with Alternative One outlined below.

ALTERNATIVES FOR ACTION

The following alternative actions are available to San Diego LAFCO and can be accomplished through a single-approved motion.

Alternative One (recommended):

Ratify approval of the outside-of-agency wastewater service agreement between the City of Escondido and the two subject parcels provided as Attachment Three.

<u>Alternative Two:</u> Continue item to a future meeting.

PROCEDURES FOR CONSIDERATION

This item has been placed on San Diego LAFCO's agenda as part of the consent calendar. A successful motion to approve the consent calendar will include taking affirmative action on the staff recommendation unless otherwise specified.


