



Recommendations

- 3. Disapprove the proposal with direction to the Executive Officer to return at the next regular meeting with a conforming resolution for adoption.

Background

- **Early 1930s** "Dust Bowl" crisis creates national Soil Conservation Service (SCS)
- Late 1930s "Soil Conservation Districts" (SCD) emerge at a state-level
- 1970s Powers expanded to include "related resources," including fish and wildlife habitat named as "Resource Conservation Districts" (CA PCR Section 9001 et seq.)
 - **1970s to 1990s** 15 RCDs operating throughout San Diego County
- **1995 to present -** 3 remaining RCDS in San Diego County



Notable Recommendations

- 1. RCDs are explicit municipal service providers and LAFCO should prepare regular reviews going forward
- 2. LAFCO should coordinate with all three RCDs in developing performance measurements for mutual benefit and incorporate into future municipal service reviews and/or reorganizations.
- 3. LAFCO should work with stakeholders and local legislators to propose a comprehensive rewrite of the RCD principal act.
- 4. The RCDs should voluntarily proceed in taking corrective measures to comply with LAFCO statute and align municipal services with jurisdictional boundaries.

Notable Recommendations

- 5. All three RCDs are reminded to request & receive written approval <u>or</u> confirmation of exemption status before providing services outside their boundaries under Government Code.
- 6. The County should consider expanding their permit process to incorporate RCD reviews of erosion and sediment control plans.
- 7. LAFCO should expand the baseline information collected in this MSR and provide a quantified assessment in the next MSR, include next level analysis (e.g. reorganization options).
- 8. Update all three RCD spheres of influence with no changes.
