The Delta Stewardship Council was recently sent a submittal from the Fallbrook Public Utilities District ("Fallbrook") related to a September 17, 2020, letter from the Bay Delta Watermaster. That letter had been submitted by our agency, the San Diego County Water Authority ("Water Authority") in regards to a LAFCO proceeding here in San Diego. Both Fallbrook and Rainbow Municipal Water District ("Rainbow") have sought to detach from the Water Authority and move water wholesalers, a request being reviewed by our local LAFCO.

Apparently, Fallbrook's submittal was intended to show two things to the Delta Stewardship Council: (1) that Fallbrook and other agencies are reducing their overall demands on the Bay-Delta via various programs; and (2) that Fallbrook's sought reorganization will not have any effect on Bay-Delta water usage. As to the first point, that is not at issue in the San Diego LAFCO proceeding. If agencies are developing their own local supplies to reduce Bay-Delta water usage, this is full in accord with State law and policy, all of which is well known by your Council. Indeed, the Water Authority has worked diligently to further such goals, most notably by the landmark QSA water transfers which helped move the San Diego region away from MWD's Bay-Delta reliance and onto firm Colorado River supplies.

As to the second point, however, the Fallbrook submittal is in error. The proposed reorganizations by Fallbrook and Rainbow would increase water usage from the Bay-Delta. This is all detailed in the Water Authority's Response submitted to the local LAFCO, which Response and exhibits can be found at this LAFCO website: San Diego County Water Authority Response [9/18/20] | San Diego LAFCO (sdlafco.org) See, in particular, pages 95-100. Notably, the Bay-Delta friendly QSA water supply is what Fallbrook and Rainbow now seek to leave, moving onto MWD's more Bay-Delta reliant supplies.

Additionally, the Water Authority has recently submitted to LAFCO a reply to various submittals, including the Fallbrook submittal to your Council, as well as new reports from its consultant Stratecon, Inc., related to the Bay-Delta. They are all included with this letter.
