



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Municipal Service Reviews (MSRs)

OVERVIEW

- Independently evaluate services relative to informing LAFCO's other regulatory and planning functions
- MSRs serve as the Commission's instrument in State law to exercise considerable power to facilitate boundary changes or initiate on its own certain reorganizations – like forming, consolidating, and dissolving special districts
- This MSR focuses on the City of Poway




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Background & Context

- The first official census for the Poway "township" was performed in 1870 and estimated the total number of residents at 91
- Incorporated in December 1980 and self-identified as the "City in the Country"
- Incorporation included the reorganization and dissolution of 5 special districts
- Poway is a full-service municipality with limited exceptions
- Governance provided by a five-member Council with a directly elected Mayor
- Poway has grown to an estimated population of approximately 49,000 residents

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Recommendations

- 1. San Diego LAFCO should update its statutory program on disadvantaged unincorporated communities and concurrently revisit the eligibility of lands immediately to the north of the City of Poway's sphere of influence
- 2. It would be timely for the City of Poway to perform an update to the General Plan (1991)
- 3. The limited progress in building new housing in the City of Poway over the reporting period merits City policies and/or procedures being revisited
- 4. San Diego LAFCO should expand the analysis of this introductory document as part of the next scheduled municipal service review

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
Recommendations

- 5. San Diego LAFCO should revisit fire protection and emergency medical services in the City of Poway as part of an expected update to the Commission's countywide fire service study
- 6. No reorganization alternatives have been identified by San Diego LAFCO that merit analysis at this time
- 7. San Diego LAFCO should proceed to update the City of Poway's sphere of influence with no changes at this time

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Item 7b | Addendum to RCD MSR

ADDENDUM TOPIC

 Clarify Upper San Luis Rey RCD's authorized service functions and classes

SPECIFIC INTEREST

• Upper San Luis Rey RCD's standing to provide groundwater management in GSA

ADDENDUM APPROACH

 Determine available RCD functions in principal act + appropriate process to categorize RCD classes to functions = Upper San Luis Rey RCD's authorized functions and classes



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Item 7b | Addendum to RCD MSR

THREE KEY CONCLUSIONS

- 1. Upper San Luis Rey RCD is out of compliance with CKH in providing groundwater management
- 2. LAFCO takes no position with respect to whether Upper San Luis Rey is separately authorized by State under SGMA
- 3. Upper San Luis Rey RCD should apply with LAFCO to activate a groundwater management class to comply with CKH and harmonize any separate allowances under SGMA.
