DISCUSSION SUMMARY SAN DIEGO LAFCO EAST COUNTY FIRE PROTECTION COMMITTEE SEPTEMBER 26, 2016

There being a quorum present, the meeting was convened at 9:50 a.m. by Executive Officer Michael Ott. Also present were: Committee Officers – Supervisor Dianne Jacob (arrived at 9:55 a.m.); Special District Member Jo MacKenzie; Special District Member Ed Sprague and Public Member Andy Vanderlaan. LAFCO Staff – Executive Officer Michael Ott; Local Governmental Analyst Joe Serrano; Local Government Consultant John Traylor; LAFCO Consultant Rich Miller and Administrative Assistant Erica Blom.

Item 1

Welcome/Refreshments

Executive Officer Michael Ott welcomed the Committee Members to the first meeting of the San Diego LAFCO East County Fire Protection Committee Meeting.

Item 2 Introductions

Michael Ott requested that each member introduce themselves to the Committee.

Item 3

Appointment of Committee Officers: Chair/Vice Chair

Jo MacKenzie placed a motion on the floor to elect Supervisor Dianne Jacob for the Chair position and it was seconded by Andy Vanderlaan. The Committee also selected Jo MacKenzie as its Vice Chair.

Item 4

Review of Draft Committee Resolution and LAFCO Budget Allocation

Michael Ott gave a brief summary of the Draft Resolution and Budget Impact establishing the San Diego LAFCO East County Fire Protection Committee. Mr. Ott said that LAFCO staff has projected a \$100,000 mid-year budget adjustment that may be necessary in order to complete a review of the two reorganization proposals for Lakeside FPD and San Miguel FPD. The Committee reviewed the information and had no further comments to transmit to the full Commission on October 3, 2016.

Joe Serrano, Local Governmental Analyst, presented a report for the upcoming San Diego LAFCO East County Fire Protection Committee Meeting Schedule. LAFCO Consultant John Traylor narrated the tour.

SUBJECT: CSA No. 115 History and Submittal of Competing Applications
Report

For the past three years, LAFCO staff has been actively involved with a number of fire agencies to address long-term fire protection and emergency medical service issues in the unincorporated Pepper Drive area located.

number of fire agencies to address long-term fire protection and emergency medical service issues in the unincorporated Pepper Drive area, located south of the City of Santee and north of the City of El Cajon. Pepper Drive is located within County Service Area No. 115 that is responsible for providing fire protection to this densely populated suburban area consisting of nearly 450 acres. There are over 1,600 housing units and approximately 4,300 residents within the CSA No. 115 service area. Refer to attached map and profile of CSA No. 115 for further information. This report summarizes the LAFCO procedure and application requirements associated with a proposed reorganization of CSA No. 115. For descriptive purposes, the procedures can be divided into four categories: (1) Preapplication, (2) Application, (3) LAFCO Review, and (4) LAFCO Hearing/Conducting Authority Proceedings.

PREAPPLICATION

CSA No. 115 was originally formed in 1985 following the merger of the Santee Fire Protection District with the City of Santee. From 1985 to 2016, CSA No. 115 had been responsible for structural fire protection and emergency medical services within the Pepper Drive area via a contract with the City of Santee. In May 2013, San Diego LAFCO began collecting fire protection call data in response to inquiries from the San Miguel Consolidated Fire Protection District (FPD) and Lakeside FPD, who both expressed interest in dissolution of CSA No. 115 and annexation of the dissolved CSA territory. While the County of San Diego had historically contracted with the City of Santee to serve the predominantly single-family residential area, LAFCO staff's collection of call history data determined that other fire providers, including San Miguel Consolidated FPD, Lakeside FPD, and the City of El Cajon also responded to a number of calls within the unincorporated community.

The County of San Diego subsequently revised its contracting procedures and released a new contract in April 2016 that reimburses first responders based on quarterly response data. Refer to Attachment C and D for an illustration of first responder activity in CSA No. 115. A number of meetings with representatives from LAFCO and the two fire districts occurred from June 2013 to September 2014 to discuss a more efficient method to deliver fire service in the area. To assist the districts in evaluating the merits of a possible reorganization of the CSA, consultant assistance was provided by LAFCO to the San Miguel and Lakeside FPDs through an arrangement with Rich Miller, President of Metro Plan LLC.

APPLICATION

The following year, in March 2015, the Board of Directors for San Miguel Consolidated and Lakeside Fire Protection Districts both submitted separate applications with LAFCO to initiate a reorganization CSA No. 115/Pepper Drive. The reorganization proposals both involved the dissolution of CSA No. 115, the concurrent annexation of the dissolved territory to the respective districts and the completion of any related sphere/service review actions. Pursuant to Government Code Section 56657, LAFCO may not approve a reorganization proposal until it has considered any other proposals that may conflict with the subject proposal, provided that the (other) proposal was submitted to the Commission within 60-days of the submission of the subject proposal. This provision in State Law applied to the two conflicting applications. Therefore, both proposals must be processed and considered by LAFCO together.

Application submitted by SMCFPD (March 2, 2015)

Due to the complexity of the proposed reorganizations, San Diego LAFCO staff formed a stakeholder committee consisting of representatives from both fire districts to resolve issues, address concerns of both parties and identify possible alternatives. During the last 60 days, the districts have re-established constructive discussions, and have expressed interest in modifying their applications to equitably divide the CSA territory and revenues. LAFCO staff is in agreement with this cooperative approach and has offered to process the two conflicting applications using a joint application approach. To further assist in the collaborative efforts, the Commission formed an ad hoc committee which is scheduled for two upcoming meetings, including a visit to the districts' new fire station sites on September 26, 2016.

LAFCO REVIEW

Based on past experience within reorganization proposals, a minimum of six months should be allowed for LAFCO review. However, the length of time depends on a number of factors, primarily the completeness of the submitted application, concurrence on terms and conditions, and any unresolved issues of local concern. Staff is projecting the proposed CSA No. 115 reorganization may take 9-12 months before it is ready for Commission consideration.

At this stage of the LAFCO process, the following actions are taking place: (1) reviewing the boundaries of the proposed reorganization to identify the respective portions of CSA No. 115 will be annexed to each district; (2) identifying issues that need to be addressed through terms and conditions; (3) analyzing the fiscal feasibility of both districts; (4) identifying issue areas/legal questions that may impede reorganization discussions or require further research; (5) evaluating the adopted 4-way contract with the County of San Diego and the East County fire agencies, and (6) coordinating with stakeholders and LAFCO staff on all of the above.

LAFCO HEARING/CONDUCTING AUTHORITY PROCEEDINGS

A public hearing will be scheduled after LAFCO staff has completed its analysis and resolution of reorganization, sphere of influence, and service review-level issues. If any of the affected districts decide to withdraw or modify their applications, a hearing will need to be postponed until an agreement has been reached. If no changes have been made and LAFCO approves the reorganization, an election would be held if at least 25% or more of the registered voters or landowners submit written protests at a conducting authority (protest) hearing. In light of the potential for continuances, requests for reconsideration, or other unforeseen delays, four months should be allowed for the LAFCO hearing and conducting authority proceedings. Below is a projected timeline of the next steps relating to the LAFCO procedure and proposed reorganization.

Completion of Conducting Authority Proceedings (Sept 2017)

We hope that the information discussed above will describe the history and ongoing efforts to address past, present, and future service needs within CSA No. 115. LAFCO staff looks forward in working with the Committee and fire agencies on this important public safety matter.







The Santee FPD was a subsidiary district of the City and governed by the Santee City Council; however, approximately 0.6 square mile of FPD territory, which contained the Pepper Drive area, was outside the City

Dear Mr. Serrano,

We would like to thank you and LAFCO staff for your assistance during the past several months with the conflicting CSA 115 annexation proposals submitted by both San Miguel Consolidated Fire Protection District and Lakeside Fire Protection District. Both Districts desire has been to ensure that the communities will receive the highest level of fire service delivery. It has not been an easy process balancing not only the needs of the communities; but, also, the cost of services provided.

Both District Boards have agreed to move forward with the recommended terms and conditions set forth below. Upon further discussion, the Districts have decided to move forward with the conditions recommended by LAFCO with a few modifications as noted below.

Prior to the final recordation of the reorganization, the Districts shall enter into a property tax sharing agreement which will equally divide and distribute the revenues being generated within the former boundaries of County Service Area #115 (Pepper Drive).

The agreement shall provide the following:

- The County shall maintain and distribute to both Districts a separate Tax/Revenue Accountability Report for property taxes generated from the former boundaries of CSA 115.
- By August 1st of every year, San Miguel shall provide the last Tax/Revenue Accountability Report for the preceding fiscal year of the former CSA 115 to Lakeside.

- By August 1st of every year, Lakeside shall provide the last Tax/Revenue Accountability Report for the preceding fiscal year of the former CSA 115 to San Miguel.
- If a District receives more than 50% of the property tax revenues from its portion of the reorganization area, that District shall provide the other District with the amount required to create an equal amount within 30 days of August 1st of every year.
- The agreement shall include a 10% penalty for late or non-payment (beyond September 15th of every year).
- At any time, at the mutual written consent of the Districts, the provisions of the agreement may be terminated and the Districts will continue to receive the property tax revenues received from their portion of the former CSA 115 with no further adjustments required.
- When construction of San Miguel's fire station at the corner of North 1st Street and Pepper Drive in El Cajon, California, is completed, the Districts agree to the detachment of the property of the Pepper Drive Fire Station from Lakeside Fire District into San Miguel Fire District.
- The agreement shall become null and void if the Lakeside Fire Protection District, or successor, closes Fire Station #1 located at 8035 Winter Gardens Blvd, Lakeside, California, or if the San Miguel Consolidated Fire Protection District, or successor, closes a fire station that services the boundaries of the "Bostonia Special Benefit Fee Area" (see attached map).

We understand that this is only the start of this joint process and both agencies will need to continue to participate in future meetings. We hope to obtain LAFCO's recommendation as well as approval of the LAFCO Commission that both of our annexation proposals will be processed and move forward as one joint annexation proposal.
